Step 1

Step 2

Register to be baptized during one of our Sunday services

After meeting with one of our pastors, you'll be sent a baptism registration link. You'll be able to pick a date, a service time, and add any requests for a particular pastor to baptize you.



Step 3

Be baptized!

Why Baptize?

Jesus said in Matthew 28:19, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Jesus' death on the cross purchased our salvation by his own shed blood. He was buried and rose again three days later.

Believer's baptism by immersion is a picture of God's grace through Christ where a believer identifies with Christ. "We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:4).

Baptism, therefore, is the submersion into water of a believer in Christ in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. It pictures our adoption into Christ, our cleansing from sin, and our commitment to the Lord and His church. May each baptism we celebrate together remind each of us of our life in Christ, and how we are bound together as one in community
