Laying a Foundation

Read Genesis 1:1 to 2:3 to prepare for today's lesson.

Creation is a truth that the world is against. Answers in Genesis has an <u>amazing website for kids</u> that explains the science behind Biblical creation. Take some time after this week's lesson to explore with your kids what this website has to offer. As we finish up creation this week, think of ways that you can continue to talk about these truths as your children grow. Talk about the exquisite design of each flower, leaf and animal. Talk about the way God made each person unique, special and in His own image. Instill in your children an awe of God and His mighty power.

Certainly you have heard of how people who work with US currency are trained to spot a counterfeit dollar. They are **not** given counterfeit money to study. On the contrary, they only study the real thing until they know it so well that they are able to immediately spot counterfeit money. Let's work with our children to know the Bible and what it says about God and how He created the world. By the time they leave your home for school, let's make sure they KNOW the truth!

My Creation Book

This is our last week to use our Creation Kits. Today's fun items are a plastic animal and a small container of playdough. See if your preschooler can name the animal God made. As they play with the playdough, remind them that God made them!

Read the Beginner's Bible account of Genesis 1 on pages 7-13. Days 6 and 7 are on page 13 through 17.

Creation Book Day 6

Have your child glue the cutout of a person to the page. Let them decorate the person to look like themselves. They can add the animal stickers around the page.

Talk

Use these questions to help you review the story with your child:

- Who created the world?
- What did God create on days 1 and 2? (Light, Darkness, Sky, Water)
- What did God create on days 3 and 4?? (Dry Land, Seas, Sun, Moon, Stars and Planets)
- What did God create on day 5? (fish and birds)
- What did God create on day 6? (land, animals and people)
- What did God say after each day? (It was good.)
- What did God do on the 7th day? (He rested.)

Note: On the 7th day, God rested. (Genesis 2:2) We know from Scripture that God never tires (Isaiah 40:28). Yet He gave us this example, that we might understand the importance of rest. Talk about this with your child.
