Upon her passing in November, parent and fellow Preschool Ministry volunteer Nicole Tallent-Smith shared this reflection on the impact Miss Jerry made in the lives of the young children and parents she served here at Carmel.



Miss Jerry was a little lady with a big heart for young children – a faithful teacher who rarely ever missed a Sunday and longed to be in the classroom each week. At the beginning of each ministry school year, she took pride in getting her Sunday morning classroom roster and she set to work to learn each child's name and those of their parents. I know for a fact that she prayed for each and every child, by name, throughout each week. She loved to send cards and notes to the kids in her class to let them know they were special and loved, too.

In recent years, Miss Jerry would talk to me about how frustrated she was with her dysphonia, the condition she had that affected her vocal cords. She was so afraid they wouldn't be able to understand her as she read the Bible. But she pressed on faithfully. She shared that she was always tired on Sundays because all of the talking wore her out. **But she did not EVER stop trying to talk about Jesus.**

She was the happiest while teaching the Bible, with children sitting at her feet. As much as I will miss her here, I take such comfort in knowing that she is now sitting at the feet of the Savior she loved and served so well!
